

THE TWENTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Dear friends / Estimados amigos,

Books about food and cooking are everywhere these days. There are three full aisles of cookbooks in the Barnes and Noble in Montgomeryville, and even our own Festival Garage Sale had a large section full of the same. Indeed, a trip to any local bookseller will reveal cookbooks representing ethnic cuisines and specialties to would-be gourmets. They are even more segregated by cooking style: healthy heart, diabetic, paleo, or low-gluten. Along with the books detailing the preparation of food, there are tons of books from nutritionists, TV-star celebrity chefs, exercise aficionados and one food guru after another offering a healthier alternative to fad diets, and he quantities and daily calorie maximums which will constitute our well-being.

While we are rightly concerned about our physical condition, the Scriptures for this weekend invite us to be similarly – if not more greatly – concerned about our spiritual health and well-being. They remind us of two types of food that are necessary for maintaining the life of faith and service to which we are to be as Jesus' disciples.

The Old Testament reading from the Book of Proverbs describes the spiritual food of wisdom, those teachings that inform our relationship with God and our attempts to live in accord with the responsibilities of being in a relationship with God. In terms that describe a kind of sumptuous buffet, with Wisdom personified as a fine maître de, she describes her table offerings. But the things she describes as "foods" are given to promote understanding and life. Her fare is rich and nourishing for mind, body, and will. Wisdom's food feeds the spirit. The psalmist urges us to "taste and see the goodness of the Lord." Taste as in to seek out the teachings of God which mold and shape and nourish mind and will.

Jesus invites those whom He fed with the loaves and fishes to feed also upon His teachings, which are sort of instructional food. Many accepted Jesus' invitation and made His teaching the nourishing bread by which they lived, following Jesus in mind and will. Today in unabashedly direct terms (John 6: 55 - 56), Jesus calls His flesh "real food" and His blood "real drink." He invites His listeners to feed on His flesh and drink His blood. The food which Jesus offers is to be chewed and ingested and assimilated as food for the body. This is none other than the sacramental bread and wine, the gift of Jesus' flesh and blood as food for the life of the world.

Jesus is the food that puts us in touch with our God and with Him. He is also the food that challenges us daily to become more and more like Him who abides with and in us. God does not merely give food; in Jesus He IS food, the type of which we all need: food for the body and food for the spirit. Let us eat up and follow His Gospel directions for the menu of life.

The start of RCIA, the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, is almost here. With Fr. Forlano's assignment to another parish, we have to make some changes (we'll call them improvements) to the RCIA program here at St. Stanislaus for the upcoming session. Deacon Tony Bellitto and I will be the "point persons" for the overall structure and advancement of the RCIA. We start this and every year with an INVITATION to anyone who is interested in becoming Catholic, needs to finish up their initiation sacraments (i.e., those who have not been confirmed or received the Eucharist but were baptized Catholic-Christian), anyone who wants to "go deeper" in their knowledge of the faith, or accompany someone who wants to do any of the above. RCIA is the place where new adult Catholics are formed. This does not require making any type of commitment at this time. It is merely an opportunity to "come and see" what God might be calling you to! This is always an exciting, but tenuous journey of self-discovery and faith discovery, but one worth taking. We begin RCIA in September, so think and pray about your personal participation in RCIA this year. See page 6 for additional details. HAVE A GOOD WEEK EVERYONE!



MINISTERIO HISPANO Vigésimo Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario: 19 de agosto de 2018 Intención de la misa: Almas en Purgatorio

Cuando era niño, mi madre me llevaba a la misa de la parroquia a las 11:00 en punto los domingos. A veces, si tenía que trabajar, iría a otra Misa pero tenía un amigo o un miembro de la familia que me llevaba a la Misa de las 11:00 en punto.

Estaba acostumbrado a ir a la iglesia en ese momento y la mayoría de las veces parecía la misma semana tras semana. Los himnos serían diferentes y un sacerdote diferente venia a celebrar la misa cada fin de semana. Pero muchas cosas eran iguales: mi asiento, la gente a mi alrededor en sus mismos asientos, la iglesia incluso olía igual con el débil enviado de incienso de la Misa anterior.

Eventualmente, me volví realmente bueno golpeando a mi amigo Sean, que estaba sentado a unos bancos de distancia, con pequeñas bolas de papel que había arrancado de las esquinas de los himnarios.

Me volví tan distraído que al levantarme para dar un paseo rápido al baño y volver era como ir en una gran aventura a un país extranjero. Mi madre, por supuesto, se dio cuenta. No recuerdo exactamente cuántas veces me gritaría después de misa por portarme mal o por ser irreverente. Me gustaba ir a la iglesia y ver a mis amigos y experimentar el entorno familiar. Además, me gustaba salir de la iglesia, volver a ver a mis amigos y asistir a las actividades de la parroquia después de la Misa.

Fue la parte media de estar en la iglesia lo que me pareció aburrido. Entonces, ¿qué cambió? ¡Algo debe haber cambiado desde el momento en que golpeé a Sean directamente en el oído con una bola de papel particularmente devastadora y el día en que fui ordenado sacerdote!
