THE TWENTY-SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Dear friends / Estimados amigos,

The Gospel this weekend follows directly upon the one that we heard last Sunday. As you may recall, in response to the disciples' inflated sense of self-importance, Jesus stood a child in their midst and explained that true greatness comes from service. Yet the disciples still don't "get it." John brings up a situation where others were able to drive out demons, but they (the apostles) could not, and they were powerless to stop the practice. Sounds like the disciples had become so caught up in a status game that they had made discipleship an exclusive club in which only the bona fide members had the right to promote the Kingdom. They wanted to guard their privilege. Jesus again returns to the theme of littleness: "Anyone who gives you a cup of water to drink because you belong to Christ, amen, I say to you, will surely not lose his reward."

Once there was a poor farmer who was a heavy drinker. When he over-drank, he would become abusive, forcing his family to escape into their cornfield to hide, with him frequently shooting after them with a .22 rifle. One day an elderly Amish neighbor came to the farm. He explained that rodents had been in his corncrib and asked the famer if he knew anyone who would sell him a .22. A bargain was quickly struck and the old farmer took the rifle and ammunition and started home. One of the poor famer's children followed him. From a distance he watched him cross the river's bridge, stop midstream, and drop the rifle and ammunition in the swift water. Then he continued home.

The generosity of heart and humility of spirit to buy and then destroy the rifle is the Amish farmer's "cup of water" that Jesus speaks about today. Christ asks all of us to be His followers and be compassionate . . . not feel sorry for someone and stop there, but truly walk with (suffer with) the person who is the object of our concern. Our Lord promises us that even the **simplest act of love and kindness** will be honored by God. Perhaps not now, but we meet Christ in judgment in our life to come. *Anyone* in need or in trouble has a claim on our compassion and charity because they belong to Christ. Let us not hesitate to act in the name of Jesus when the opportunity arises, and whoever crosses our path in life. With God, even a little goes a long way.

A Message from the Archdiocese of Philadelphia:

On September 21, Archbishop Chaput joined all of the Catholic bishops of Pennsylvania in issuing a joint statement pledging their support for an independent sex abuse survivors' compensation program. They deeply regret the suffering of survivors and any decisions that failed to protect them. The bishops are resolved to make things right. 



THE TWENTY-SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

MINISTERIO HISPANO

Vigésimo sexton domingo del tiempo ordinario: 30 de septiembre de 2018

Viendo como están las cosas a nuestro alrededor alguno diría que no hay piedras de molino suficientes para tantos "que escandalizan a los pequeños que creen". Es tan grave este pecado que Jesús no teme ser calificado de radical cuando aconseja sacrificar parte del propio cuerpo antes que impedir a los inocentes la entrada en el Reino de los cielos. Al que siga escandalizando "más le valiera no haber nacido", dice el Evangelio de hoy.

La noticia de un crimen de sangre nos horroriza hasta el punto de hacernos sentir en el corazón esa mezcla de dolor, de odio y deseo de venganza. En el Evangelio de hoy Jesús habla del asesinato moral que se comete contra los inocentes y los más débiles a través del escándalo. Esto puede ocurrir en nuestras propias familias o en los ambientes de trabajo o de fe. El escándalo confunde la conciencia, hace renegar de la fe y priva a un alma de su salvación eterna. Los niños son seres particularmente indefensos frente a las seducciones de los mayores.

¿Por qué tanta dureza en estas expresiones de Jesús? Porque los niños son el objeto preferido del amor de Dios; y a los que cometen injusticias contra ellos les están reservados los peores castigos. Los escándalos no sólo se dan en el comportamiento moral de las personas (abusos sexuales, deshonestidad en las palabras, mentira, ofensas) sino también en las relaciones sociales injustas (la explotación del trabajador, la corrupción política, el despilfarro en gastos inútiles, el hambre en el mundo, los abusos de poder). Por eso Santiago es radical al condenar este otro tipo de escándalo.

Detrás de cada enseñanza del Evangelio está la lógica del amor. Es la lógica del servicio fraterno, contrario a la dinámica del escándalo como negación del cristianismo. El escándalo implica un abandono del amor y un desprecio de nuestros hermanos. Por eso el planteamiento de la caridad no es ¿qué debo evitar? Sino ¿qué es lo mejor que puedo hacer por los demás?

Bueno será que, a la luz del Evangelio de hoy acabemos pensando: Si el dinero me hace olvidar a Jesucristo; si mi corazón y mi vida no necesitan de Dios más que para adorno religioso, mejor será quemar ese dinero; dárselo a los pobres. Más vale entrar desnudo en la vida que ser arrojado al abismo, forrado de oro. Querer para los demás aquel bien que yo quisiera para mí mismo, es dinámica que crea vínculos de amor, aunque no lo sepamos.

Debemos comprometernos a combatir el mal con el bien, la mentira con la verdad, el odio con el amor. Y además, que en nuestra presencia nadie pueda atreverse a escandalizar a los inocentes: ni blasfemando contra Dios, ni ensuciando la pureza del alma, ni pecando contra el amor a los hermanos. ¡Recordemos la piedra de molino!
