THE TWENTY-EIGHTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Dear friends / Estimados amigos,

Only one place in the Gospels does a person who has a personal encounter with Jesus leave unhappy. It happens in this Sunday's Scriptures this weekend, in the account of the Rich Young Man's meeting with Jesus. He comes to meet the "good teacher" with good intentions and looking for a sure answer to his question: "what must I do to inherit eternal life?" Jesus responds with the core demands of the Jewish tradition – keep the Commandments, love God, do no harm, treat others well, and be faithful to your family.

For the young man, this was no problem. He had the Ten Commandments covered. Jesus admires his zeal. One almost expects Jesus to give him a slap on the back, an "A" for effort, or stamp his "get into heaven free" card. But that is not what Jesus says or does. Rather, he asks him to go deeper with the invitation of his life, essentially asking him to drop his other ambitions, unbind himself from other ties, and give to the poor all the trappings he had. The poor guy goes away stunned and extremely sad. Even the apostles who witnessed the exchange were taken back by the response of Jesus. He reassures them that they and anyone like them who risked all for Him and the Gospel would receive so much more than they could imagine. Notice that the invitation was not extended to everyone. Jesus knew not everyone could do it well. To embrace a life of dependence on God and obedience to mission is not for all. In addition, He did not want to leave out those who lived out Kingdom values in their homes. Whether iterant or living in a steady place, Jesus asked for a radically free lifestyle defined by consecration and willingness to do the will of God no matter what.

Jesus offers each of us more than we expect. He calls forth the potential we all have to be and do good. Pope Francis, in the Exhortation Guadete et Exsultate, 11 says it this way:

The important thing is that each believer discern his or her own path, that they bring out the very best of themselves, the most personal gifts that God has placed in their hearts (cf. 1 Cor 12:7), rather than hopelessly trying to imitate something not meant for them. We are all called to be witnesses, but there are many actual ways of bearing witness.

We are all individually called to serve in Jesus' mission. Our summons is personal, unique, and tailored to our gifts and dispositions. God never asks us to do the impossible, but rather to meet whatever challenges head-on with God's help. Like the Rich Young Man, we are invited to accept by becoming more than we can imagine. It's part of the Gospel's "Inconvenient Truth" that can speak to the world.

Cries for reform of civil and ecclesiastical law get louder by the day. Undoubtedly the volume level will be upped to maximum this week in Harrisburg, as legislators consider opening a "window" in the state's statute of limitations on sexual abuse. It will a tough week for the institutional Church because of the stakes involved. What kind of financial remunerations, if any, will be considered "just" for victims seeking justice for violations of the worst kind? Will today's parishioners have to pay for the sins of dead clerics from decades ago? Will Pennsylvania send a message to other states? These are only a few of the hard questions to be decided. Most importantly, the Church has to get to the roots of this crisis and make needed changes so that the egregious acts of the past do not happen again. Placing the blame exclusively on a "culture of clericalism," homosexuality in the priesthood, insufficient Seminary formation, lay people who looked the other way, or any other single cause is way too neat and an easy way to clear one's conscience about what prevention efforts need to be developed. That's why our prayers for God's intervention in this mess are so very necessary. Please keep praying for the victims, for PA legislators, and for the decision makers in the Church, a particular priority this week.

From Msgr. Tracy: Festival Results are in! Despite two drizzly evenings and threatening skies on other days, the St. Stanislaus Summer Festival – 2018





This program will begin on October 16 at 7pm in the Parish Center. Subsequent sessions will be held on Thursdays starting on October 25 at 7pm.



This is the foundational study in *The Great Adventure* Bible Study Series that has helped hundreds of thousands of Catholics learn to read the Bible. *TBT* is a fascinating study that takes participants on a journey through the entire Bible. They will go deep into each period of salvation history and discover the amazing story woven throughout all of Scripture. Key people and events that advance the story are highlighted so that the newcomer isn't overwhelmed with too much at once. The study's objectives are:

If you can not make the full payment at this time, please bring in a \$10 deposit on Tuesday, October 16's first meeting, and the rest will be payable in 2 other installments in November and January (\$12.50/each). Books will be ordered after we see how many people are interested in attending the study, to ensure we get the appropriate number of copies.








SER RICO, PARA BIEN O PARA MAL

Para quien crea que es fácil entrar al cielo, que lea el Evangelio de hoy. El ojo de aguja al que se refiere el texto, es un arco estrecho en las calles de Jerusalén y resulta muy dificil que un camello pueda pasar, pero no imposible. Pues más dificil va a ser el que un rico entre al cielo, según dice Jesús. Las riquezas pueden ser un obstáculo; sin embargo, en otros pasajes Jesús aclara que el dinero bien administrado puede convertirse en obras de caridad y en responsabilidad frente a los bienes de la tierra, que faciliten la entrada al cielo.

- 1. Las riquezas tienen una fuerza seductora y opresora; tienen un poder hipnotizador. En sí mismos los bienes materiales no son buenos ni malos, pero se hacen malos cuando los transformamos en el objetivo de nuestra vida. Las riquezas endurecen el corazón del hombre y lo hacen insensible ante el dolor del prójimo. Por dinero se venden armas y se hacen la mayoría de las guerras; por amor al dinero, pueblos enteros son sumidos en la miseria, mientras otros son esclavizados; por amor al dinero surge la infidelidad matrimonial, el abandono de los hijos, y se rompen viejas amistades. Con nuestro dinero podemos comprar el cielo o el infierno; todo depende del buen o mal uso que hagamos de él. El destino más grandioso que podemos dar a los bienes de este mundo es compartirlos: "Ve, vende todo lo que tienes y dalo a los pobres", le dice Jesús al joven rico. La mayor parte de la gente se vuelve loca porque vive para tener, pero sería feliz si procurar tener para vivir.
- 2. No debe extrañarnos la pregunta que le hacen a Jesús: "¿Señor, quién podrá salvarse?" Y la respuesta: "Para el hombre es imposible, sólo es posible para Dios". Es lo que nos enseña la parábola de la perla preciosa en la que el mercader vende todo lo que tiene y va a comprar la perla de gran valor.
- 3. No olvidemos que al final de nuestra vida rendiremos cuentas ante Dios. Él me va a calificar no por los trabajos que realicé, sino por los motivos que tuve en lo que hice o no hice. Se me acreditarán más los esfuerzos que los resultados; se me mirará más el corazón que las manos. Al fin, si el corazón está limpio, será imposible que las manos no obren limpiamente.

Hermanas y hermanos: La pregunta del rico es la pregunta del hombre: "¿que haré para heredar la vida eterna?" ¿Y yo? ¿Estoy excesivamente preocupado por el dinero? ¿Consumo demasiado? ¿Disfruto de lo mucho que tengo? ¡Aprendamos a dar lo nuestro al necesitado para descubrir el secreto de la alegría cristiana!
