Dear Friends,

Next Saturday we are going to celebrate First Holy Communion for our parish community. This is a day of great joy for our parish and for all of the families who will be celebrating this great moment in their children's lives. I can remember a few things about my own First Communion: the white suit (which was later slightly green from playing in the grass afterword); the party (where I was hoping to save up enough money for a Sega Genesis); and the classic school photo in my suit (which hung awkwardly in our house for two decades). At seven I may not have understood the meaning of the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist, but I did believe. Thirty years later, I am still growing in my understanding and love of Christ's eternal sacrifice and the depth of love He has for us that He comes to us in the Eucharist in each and every Mass. Please pray for all of our First Communicants, and our parish family, that we may continue to grow in our love, adoration, and belief in the real presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist.

I know that many people have noticed the recent changes in and around our Church. The new tiles and mosaics have been installed around the Baptismal font, greatly enhancing that special space in our Church. The mosaics incorporate the symbols of Baptism, and the octagon around the font teaches us that in Baptism we die with Christ and rise with Him to new life on the eighth day, the day of the Resurrection. A special thank you to our anonymous donors for helping our Church preach our beliefs in the mysteries revealed through our sacraments. Also, the ground outside the Adoration Chapel is being prepared for an outdoor statue shrine area. This is an Eagle Scout project of parishioner T.J. Garner. He has organized and will be continuing to oversee the installation of a patio, garden, and set-up for a new outdoor statue. Special thanks to all who are working with him to coordinate this project, especially all of the members of Troop 414 and the parish Gardening Group. The statue itself will be a separate project and we do not yet know who will be enshrined there for future prayer intentions.

PREP is open to students in grades **Pre-K through 8**.

Children who are older than 8th grade and who have not yet received their sacraments are also invited to join us! There are two session options:

- **†** Wednesday evenings (weekly) from 6:45pm 8:00pm, (K to 8) OR
- **†** Sunday mornings (bi-weekly) from 10:15am 11:30am, (*Pre-K to 8*)

The Sunday session is structured as a Family Catechesis program. Students **and** parents meet every other week. Lessons for the at-home catechesis are given to the parents to do at home for the weeks when classes are not held.

<u>SACRAMENTS</u>: The children will be prepared to receive the sacraments of *Reconciliation and Eucharist* for the first time in 2nd grade. It is a *two-year* preparation process. Children who are older than 2nd grade, and who have not yet received these sacraments, are encouraged to register, and will participate in classes with other older children to prepare for the sacraments. The sacrament of *Confirmation* is conferred in 7th grade (*or older, depending on when you begin the preparation process*).



Queridos amigos,



El próximo sábado vamos a celebrar la Primera Comunión de nuestra comunidad parroquial. Es un día de gran alegría para nuestra parroquia y para todas las familias que van a celebrar este gran momento en la vida de sus hijos. Recuerdo algunas cosas de mi primera comunión: el traje blanco (que luego quedó un poco verde por jugar en la hierba después); la fiesta (en la que esperaba ahorrar suficiente dinero para un Sega Genesis); y la clásica foto del colegio con mi traje (que colgó incómodamente en nuestra casa durante dos décadas). Puede que a los siete años no entendiera el significado de la presencia real de Jesús en la Eucaristía, pero creía. Treinta años después, sigo creciendo en mi comprensión y amor por el sacrificio eterno de Cristo y la profundidad del amor que nos tiene al venir a nosotros en la Eucaristía en todas y cada una de las Misas.
