Dear Friends,

This weekend we welcome Fr. Mark Marangone, s.x., an Xaverian Missionary from the St. Francis Xavier Foreign Mission Society, who will be preaching the Mission Appeal at our parish as part of the annual Missionary Cooperation Plan. Fr. Mark was born in Italy and ordained a priest in 1984 in his hometown near Udine, some 70 miles northeast of Venice, and is a graduate of the Catholic Theological Union at Chicago. After 12 years of service in the USA, first in Wisconsin and then in New Jersey, he did 13 years of missionary work in Colombia, South America. For a couple of years, he served in Vocation Ministry in the Capital City of Bogotá, and then nine years in "La Encarnación" Parish. He returned to the USA in 2011 to serve as Local Superior of the Xavier Mission Society Center at Franklin, WI, and since May 2016 as Provincial Superior in Wayne, NJ.

The St. Francis Xavier Foreign Mission Society was founded in 1895 in Parma, Italy, by St. Guido Maria Conforti, under the patronage of St. Francis Xavier, SJ. It is exclusively a foreign mission society, with about 700 members coming from 17 countries and serving in 21. The Xaverian Missionaries (Priests and Brothers) depend greatly on proceeds from friends and benefactors. They began serving in mainland China in 1899 among non-Christians. Expelled from there in the early 1950's, they were invited to serve in other countries in Asia, Africa and the Americas. They are involved in evangelization, interreligious dialogue, service to the most in need, formation of leaders, education et al. They carry out their service in Bangladesh, Brazil, Burundi, Cameroon, Chad, Colombia, the Democratic Republic of Congo, France, Indonesia, Italy, Japan, Mexico, Morocco (since October 2020), Mozambique, the Philippines, Sierra Leone, Spain, Taiwan, Thailand, the United Kingdom, and the United States. 



Preparation for the sacraments of Reconciliation and First Holy Communion is a two-year process. The children must complete Level 1 prior to entering Level 2. ~ Primary Catechists for Level 1 on Sunday & Wednesday - The primary catechist plans and teaches the class. All resources and training are provided.



Este fin de semana damos la bienvenida al P. Mark Marangone, s.x., Misionero Javeriano de la Sociedad de Misiones Extranjeras San Francisco Javier, que predicará el Llamamiento Misionero en nuestra parroquia como parte del Plan anual de Cooperación Misionera. El P. Mark nació en Italia y fue ordenado sacerdote en 1984 en su ciudad natal, cerca de Udine, a unas 70 millas al noreste de Venecia, y es licenciado por la Catholic Theological Union de Chicago. Tras 12 años de servicio en Estados Unidos, primero en Wisconsin y luego en Nueva Jersey, realizó 13 años de labor misionera en Colombia (Sudamérica). Durante un par de años sirvió en la Pastoral Vocacional en la capital Bogotá, y luego nueve años en la Parroquia "La Encarnación".
