However, preparing for the coming of Jesus is something that we can never hurry, and must anticipate every day of our lives. I hope that as you pray at St. Stan's this Christmas, you receive the peace that comes with the knowledge that unto us our Savior is born.

When Jesus was born to Mary and Joseph, the world began to recognize this great gift. The cosmos heralded his birth, along with shepherds and foreign kings. 



The Bereavement Ministry of MMR and St. Stanislaus Parishes

Here are some tips from the Bereavement Ministry for supporting someone who is grieving during the holidays:



1. Be supportive of the way the person chooses to handle the holidays. Some may wish to follow traditions; others may choose to avoid customs of the past and do something new. It's okay to do things differently.

2. Invite the person to join you or your family during the holidays. You might invite them to join you for a religious service or at a holiday meal where they are a guest.

3. Donate a gift or money in memory of the person's loved one. Remind the person that his or her loved one is not forgotten.

4. Never tell someone that he or she should be "over it." Instead, give the person hope that, eventually, he or she will enjoy the holidays again.5. Be willing to listen. Active listening from friends and family is an important step to helping some cope with grief and heal.

6. Remind the person that you are thinking of him or her and the loved one who died. Cards, phone calls and visits are great ways to stay in touch.

7. Follow up after the holidays to check in. Given the activity of the season, some people may make it through the holidays without any issues but they might find the post-holiday period to be more difficult. So checking in after the holidays to see how he or she may be doing is helpful.
